Basque bibliography 2016

Joan Mari Torrealdai, sociologist, writer and President of the Jakin Foundation, publishes appraisal of the development of bibliographical publication in the Basque language during 2016. In this year, 2.061 books were published in the Basque language, 373 less than in 2015. Most of these publications are school books (38%), followed by children's and young people's literature (23,7%), books on human and social sciences (15,4%) and literature for adults (13%).
