Basque bibliography 2023

Xabier Eizagirre Gesalaga, a graduate in Philosophy and editor-in-chief of Jakin, publishes appraisal of the development of bibliographical publication in the Basque language during 2023. In this year, 2.791 books were published in the Basque language, 248 more than in 2022. Most of these publications are school books (46,1%), followed by schildren's and young people's literature (23,2%), books on human and social sciences (13%) and literature for adults (13,8%) and books on human and social sciences (9,2%).
